Recognize the Signs and Symptoms of Carbon Monoxide (CO) Poisoning



Headache



Shortness
of breath



Chest pain



Nausea or
vomiting



Dizziness



Collapse



Loss of consciousness

If you feel you may have any signs or symptoms **OR**
your CO alarm or CO detector sounds,

STEP 1: Get yourself and others outdoors to an area with clean air immediately.

STEP 2: CALL 911!

STEP 3: Do NOT drive a motor vehicle.

STEP 4: Stay away from the area until it is determined to be safe.

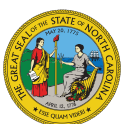
