Can't be seen > Can't be smelled > Can't be heard

BUT CAN BE STOPPED



DON'T use your stove or oven for heat. See <https://bit.ly/energyhlp> for help paying heating bills.



DON'T use a generator or other gasoline or charcoal-burning device **INSIDE** your home, basement or garage or outside close to any window, door or vent. Keep your generator at a safe distance by using an extension cord that is over 20 feet long.



DON'T run a car or truck inside an attached garage, even if you leave the garage door open.



PROTECT YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY. Install a battery-operated CO detector in your home and remember to check or replace the batteries.
